DAY 1: This morning the Travel Masters NWA begins our 13-day adventure on the Great American Scenic Safari with a song. (Imagine the tune "Surfin' Safari"): Early in the morning we'll be startin' out. Some travelers will be coming along. We're loading up our coach with our bags inside and headin' out west today. Come on (travelin') wait and see (scenic safari). Yes, I'm gonna take you travel'n' (scenic safari) with me. Come along (travelin') lady wait and see (scenic safari). Yes, I'm gonna take you travelin' (scenic safari) with me. Let's go travelin' now. Everybody's ready now. Come on the GREAT AMERICAN SCENIC SAFARI with ME! What fun! Today is a travel day to get us well on our way. As everyone knows, part of the fun of our tours are the great times we have on the road heading to our destinations. We'll be getting to know fellow travelers, so sit back, relax and enjoy the scenery looking out the large windows of our spacious motor coach. Overnight: Council Bluffs, lowa (L)

Day 2: Today is a travel day with a couple of interesting visits. This morning, we are headed to Outlook Nebraska Inc. for a **Toilet Paper Factory Tour**. This behind-the-scenes tour offers a fascinating look at a factory that produces toilet paper for the United States military, where the majority of employees are blind. Later, we'll visit the **Terry Redlin Art Center** they are staying open after hours just for us – so we'll have the Art Center all to ourselves! Several of us have visited this amazing art center before and only had one complaint — we needed more time! Terry Redlin has a great story and is an incredible artist. We'll have time to explore the galleries, watch a video about Terry, and shop in their wonderful gift shop before we depart. **Overnight: Watertown, SD (B, L, D)** 

Day 3: Welcome back to North Dakota! Today is a full day of travel, but boy, are you in for a treat tonight! The **Medora Musical** is the rootin'-tootinest, boot-scootinest show in all the West! There's no other show quite like it. Set against the outdoor splendor of the rugged North Dakota Badlands, this professionally produced, high-energy, western-style musical show proudly celebrates the legacy of America's 26th President, Theodore Roosevelt. First, we'll have dinner! We'll be enjoying the nationally acclaimed **Pitchfork Steak Fondue**. Their chefs will load steaks onto pitchforks and cook them fondue "Western style." We'll savor our steak while overlooking the picturesque Badlands from atop a bluff at the Tjaden Terrace. Your steak comes with all the fixings, so we promise you won't go away

hungry! This dining experience has even been featured on the national television show Best Of on The Food Network! Over the past 23+ years of our tours, we've enjoyed many meals, but this one ranks right up there with the best. Like we said, "Enjoy!" **Overnight: Medora, ND (B, D)** 

**Day 4:** Today we visit our first national park on this tour – **Theodore Roosevelt National Park**. This morning, we'll drive the South Unit, which features a 36-mile loop road winding through the badlands and past the park's most popular features. Keep your eyes peeled for wildlife! Later, we'll visit **Pompeys Pillar National Monument Interpretive Center**. Pompeys Pillar is like a sandstone history book, serving as a who's who of western frontier history. Look at the rock face for the remains of animal drawings created by people who used the area for rendezvous, campsites, and hunting. In 1806, Captain William Clark carved his signature and the date into this rock. It is the only site on the trail where visible evidence of the Lewis and Clark Expedition can still be seen by the public. **Overnight: Bozeman, Montana (B, L)** 

Day 5: Good morning, adventurers! Today, we have an exciting experience planned: the Gates of the Mountains Boat Ride. We'll hear the story of how Meriwether Lewis wrote in his journal about this area and how he named it "Gates of the Mountains." For nearly two centuries, travelers have ventured down this stretch of the Missouri River to marvel at its natural wonders. Today, most visitors enjoy the beauty of the Gates of the Mountains from aboard a tour boat. The 120-minute cruise begins in the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, between Helena and Great Falls, Montana. Aboard a comfortable open-air boat (covered in case of rain), you'll glide through magnificent countryside that Meriwether Lewis would still recognize if he could return. Great towering walls of limestone still stand guard over the river. Bighorn sheep and mountain goats scamper among the rocks high above the water. Ospreys, eagles (both bald and golden), vultures, and falcons (peregrine and prairie) still soar on the updrafts. The canyon is also home to otters, deer, squirrels, ermine, beavers, mountain lions, black bears, and other wild creatures. The tour's main attraction, though, is the inexhaustible scenery: wooded slopes, rugged rock formations, and the placid beauty of the timeless Missouri River. Overnight: Browning, MT (Night 1 of 2-Night Stay) (B, L)













Day 6: Today, we'll explore the natural beauty of Glacier National Park! This morning, we'll board the famous Red Buses of Glacier National Park, an ideal way to experience and learn more about the park. These vintage 1930s buses are perfect for enjoying the park's vertically oriented scenery. With their roll-back tops, they provide full views of the stunning mountains and the area's signature Big Sky. The guides, seasoned park veterans, are here because they love Glacier and enjoy sharing its wonders with us. The Travel Masters will be taking the most inclusive tour of Glacier National Park Big Sky Circle Tour. The day begins with a morning drive over Marias Pass, offering opportunities for wildlife viewing at Goat Lick. After lunch (on your own) at Lake McDonald Lodge, we'll tour the grand cedar and hemlock forests within the Lake McDonald Valley. Next, we'll ascend to the high alpine region of the Going-to-the-Sun Road at Logan Pass before descending into the St. Mary Valley. Throughout the day, we'll enjoy several photo opportunities to capture the breathtaking scenery. Following our tour, we'll return to our hotel for a well-deserved night's rest. **Overnight: Browning**, Montana (Night 2 of 2) (B)

Day 7: Look what we found – another Lewis & Clark Interpretive Center: The Lewis & Clark National Historic Trail Interpretive Center! Explore this stunning 25,000-square-foot building, where you'll be fully immersed in the legendary story of Lewis and Clark. The center not only chronicles the portage journey of the Expedition but also explains the Corps' significant experiences with Plains and Northwest Indian tribes. You'll discover details about the plants and animals documented by the Expedition and feel the disappointment they experienced upon realizing the impossibility of a Northwest Passage water route. Begin your indoor journey with a video presentation in the auditorium. Next, we're headed to Wyoming, where we'll enjoy a Prime Rib buffet at Buffalo Bill's Irma Hotel. Overnight: Cody, Wyoming (Night 1 of 2-Night Stay) (B, D)

**Day 8:** Today, we visit **Yellowstone National Park!** We have two full days of touring with a local guide who is full of knowledge about the park. Established in 1872, Yellowstone became the first national park in the world. Keep an eye out for moose, elk, bison, bears, and wolves. You will explore the major attractions of both Yellowstone's upper and lower loops on your leisurely visit to the park. Look for bison, pronghorn antelope, grizzly bears, wolves,

ospreys, and bald eagles along the Lamar River. We'll visit the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone, where you can marvel at the rushing waters of Yellowstone Falls. With breathtaking scenery, ample wildlife viewing, and opportunities to connect with the past, this visit is sure to be unforgettable. Our professional guide will provide an overview of the park's history, flora, fauna, and geology while we enjoy the passing landscapes from the comfort of our motorcoach. We will have opportunities to take pictures at the many vista stops along the way. Later, we return to Cody, where we will enjoy an all-you-can-eat dinner at the **Cody Cattle Company**. You'll love the live, amazing entertainment with **Ryan Martin and the Triple C Cowboys** will provide an evening of foot-stompin', hand-clappin' fun! Their family-style meals are unlimited, so you can fill your plate as many times as it takes to get comfortably full. **Overnight: Cody, Wyoming (Night 2 of 2) (B, D)** 

Day 9: Rise & Shine! Today, we're headed back to Yellowstone! With two full days of touring Yellowstone National Park with our local guide, we'll make all the special stops you'd expect in Yellowstone, including the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone and Old Faithful. The majority of the world's geysers are preserved here, and they are the primary reason the park was established. Old Faithful, once called "Eternity's Timepiece," is renowned for the regularity of its eruptions. Despite the myth, this geyser has never erupted at exact hourly intervals. However, it does erupt more frequently than any other large geyser. An Old Faithful eruption lasts 1.5 to 5 minutes and reaches heights of over 90 feet. Before an eruption, Old Faithful "plays" with splashes of boiling water that may reach as high as 20 feet. We'll also visit Geyser Basins and the Fountain Paint Pots. Our schedule for the two days of touring Yellowstone National Park will vary, as our local guide will plan the order of attractions to cover the most sights within the available time. Note: Tonight's hotel, Togwotee Lodge, does not have air conditioning or an elevator. The temperatures in this part of the country typically do not require air conditioning. We've stayed at this property a couple of times, and it has been a guest favorite due to its proximity to wildlife and the National Parks. Overnight: Moran, Wyoming (B, D)

**Day 10:** Waking up in the Tetons! As autumn approaches, mornings will be cooler and wildlife is more active in the morning so keep your eyes open and your cameras ready as our local step-on guide













introduces us to **Grand Teton National Park**. We'll see Jackson and Jenny Lakes, the Chapel of the Transfiguration, and of course, the rugged, towering Tetons. Rising more than 7,000 feet above the valley of Jackson Hole, the Teton Range dominates the park's skyline. Extraordinary wildlife, pristine lakes, alpine terrain and wildflowers paint the meadows in vivid colors. The Snake River, running north to south, winds its way through the valley and across this amazing scene. We will arrive in **Jackson**, **Wyoming** in time for a late lunch and free-time for photo ops of the Elk Antler Arch. We'll have plenty of time to wander around this unique town before heading to our hotel. **Overnight: Star Valley, Wyoming (B)** 

**Day 11:** Today, we start our journey back home, but we have some exciting stops planned along the way. We will visit the Wyoming Territorial Prison State Historic Site, built in 1872 and restored in 1989. The prison is the highlight of the site. We will see furnished cells, the prisoners' dining area, guard's quarters, infirmary, women's quarters, laundry room, warden's office, and various exhibit galleries. Overnight: Fort Collins, Colorado (B, L)

Day 12: Did you know that mid-September to the beginning of October is the best time to catch the changing colors and hear the elk bugling around Estes Park, Colorado? We are headed there this morning for a **Tram Ride**. Gain a bird's-eye view of Estes Park without having to hike! The Estes Park Aerial Tram will whisk us safely above the treetops to the summit of Prospect Mountain. Instead of using towers to support the wires, the tram travels across a free span of wires strung between top and bottom stations. Since 1955, it has carried more than 3 million people to the summit, where riders can spend as much time as they wish observing and photographing the gorgeous panoramas. This evening, we are headed to Colby, Kansas, where a warm welcome awaits us at David & Linda's farm. Enjoy a mouthwatering **Chuckwagon Dinner** featuring ribs, brisket, fried potatoes, salad, and delectable Dutch oven peach cobbler. It's the perfect way to end the day! Overnight: Colby, Kansas (B, D)





**Day 13:** Today is our last travel day home. We'll share great memories as we make our way back. We'll all be chattering about our "favorite" part of this wonderful itinerary. Could it be our visit to Yellowstone National Park or the Glacier National Park Big Sky Circle Tour on the Red Bus Tour? How about one of our shows? The Medora Musical with the Pitchfork Fondue Dinner or the upbeat music at the Cody Cattle Company Show & Dinner? Maybe it will be all the wild animals we saw along the way... So many fun adventures on our 13-day tour of the Great American Scenic Safari. Ouestion: Is it too soon to start talking about our next adventure? You decide! Where to next? (B)
